Backed by over 35 years of research-based effectiveness, the <u>Olweus Bullying Prevention Program</u> is a long-term, system-wide program for change throughout the school setting.

The Goals of the Olweus Bullying Prevention Program include:

- reducing existing bullying problems among students
- preventing the development of new bullying problems
- achieving better peer relations at school

All of our educators and administration have been trained to fully implement the <u>Olweus</u> <u>Bullying Prevention Program</u> through routinely coordinating specific age-level activities. These activities are geared toward helping our students focus on making and keeping friends, accepting the differences that make us all unique, and being aware of bullying and cyber bullying.
